Dr. Gralla is currently the Director of Oncology Research, Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Jacobi Medical Center, and Professor of Medicine, in New York.

His previous positions include: Chief of the Thoracic Oncology Service at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center (New York), and later as Director of the Ochsner Cancer Institute in New Orleans, Louisiana. He was then Associate Director, Herbert Irving Comprehensive Cancer Center, and Professor of Medicine, at Columbia University, in New York, and then Vice President for Cancer Services, Chief of the Division of Hematology and Oncology at the Monter Cancer Center of the North Shore-LIJ Health System in Lake Success, New York, and Professor of Medicine, at Hofstra University.
